Come and See for Lent 2023

This year for Lent Churches Together in Wendover will be studying the Beatitudes from Matthew's Gospel using material produced by Oxford Diocese called *"Come and See"*. Looking afresh at passages from Matthew's Gospel, the material should offer something for everyone: those exploring or new to faith, and also to those with a more established relationship with God.

Books to read together in Lent

Thy will be done—Stephen Cherry

During Lent WFC will be looking at aspects of the "Lords Prayer" based on the Lent book "Thy will be done" by Stephen Cherry.

In the current climate of uncertainty and widespread anxiety, discover again the freshness of our most familiar spiritual resources. Stephen Cherry's Lent Book invites the reader to immerse themselves in the most central, important and iconic of Christian prayers – the Lord's Prayer, the Our Father.



Godforsaken—Stephen Cottrell

In the Gospel of Mark's account of the Passion narrative, Jesus calls out



A book for Lent and Holy Week Stephen Cottrell from the cross 'My God, my God, why have you forsaken me?' – the first line of Psalm 22. It's an anguished expression – traditionally ascribed to King David – of defeat, failure, abandonment and despair.

Join the Archbishop of York Stephen Cottrell, as he ponders the significance of these words. What does it mean for Jesus to have quoted them, at the very end of his life? What do those words mean for us? This is a beautiful and compelling exploration of the dark, suffering side of the Passion – and how Jesus' words lead us to the greatest hope of all.

Sharing the Easter Story –Sally Welch

In this BRF Lent book Sally Welch explores two questions: What is the Easter story really about, and how do we share it?

Through each week of Lent, a different aspect of the Easter story is examined: **repenting**, **forgiving**, **hoping**, **trusting**, **sacrificing**, **loving and changing**. Within each week, the days are focused on what we need to do in order to share the story: **listening**, **understanding**, **reflecting**, **living**, **telling**, **sharing and becoming**.

Each day offers a Bible passage, followed by a reflection and a prayer.



Women of Holy Week—Paula Gooder



Women of Holy Week is a series of nine stories about nine different, but interlinked, women written by Paula Gooder, originally as Holy Week, Easter and Ascension Day reflections for Southwark Cathedral in 2021.

Starting with Palm Sunday and finishing with Ascension Day, these nine stories imagine what it might have been like to accompany Jesus in this final week of his life from the perspective of nine women. The stories also aim to travel from the outside in: from people who had the most fleeting encounters with Jesus at the start of the week to his most devoted followers at the end.
